

When I discovered God's call for me to take this school year off to serve the Toledo First church and community, I knew I was in trouble. I knew God would put me in a position where I would feel incapable, unworthy, and ineffectual much of the time. I knew God would challenge me, stretch me, and move me outside of my comfort zone. And I knew my time here wouldn't be long enough, that there would be so much more I would want to do, and so many people I wouldn't want to move away from just yet. But I don't think I could have anticipated just how much God would use this church family to help empty me of everything - every preconceived idea of what this

experience would be like, every piece of baggage I came to town with, every bit of training or education my schooling has taught meemptied me of it all in order to learn how to totally and completely depend on the awesome and mighty power of God. He has used you to

teach me to love without condition - outside the boundaries of age, background, status, or compatibility. He has used you to teach me what a vibrancy for life looks like, what ordinary outreach can do to practically reach out to people, and how to prize the time that we do have. I will cherish each relationship and friendship I have found here long after I leave. Thank you for the opportunity to serve you and to learn from you.

How could I repay such a gift God has given me in these nine months except with my life? How could I give anything in return except my sacrifice of praise! My praise will go on and on through the

different avenues God opens for me to serve Him more. This summer I'll be working as Assistant Director of North Star Camp in MN working to create an atmosphere where kids can meet the Savior and make the decision to spend their lives following Him. In the fall I'll be going back to school to Union College in Lincoln, NE to complete my Theology degree with an emphasis in Youth Ministry, and during that time I have the opportunity to serve my campus as Student Chaplain working with a team of students to create opportunities for people to experience Christ, to worship Him, and to minister to others in response to what He has done for us. Beyond that, the future is not something I know, but I am confident that our God, who holds the world in the palm of His hands, will continue to guide and direct each of our paths. May He pour abundant blessings out upon you as you faithfully serve Him, and step out in boldness because of His strength and grace to share His unconditional, unending love with the world.
