

Valentines for Zimbabwe Banquet set for February 13

February 12-13th will be a very special weekend for all of us here at Toledo First. For the third year in a row, we will be extending Valentine's love beyond our own borders to our brothers and sisters in need around the world.

Two years ago Toledo First hosted "Valentines for Rwanda," which brought clean water to villagers outside of Kitale. Last year we hosted "Valentines for India," raising nearly \$4000 for the sons of prostitutes in the Kalighat district of Kolkata (Calcutta). Thanks to your generosity, teenage boys in Kolkata now have the opportunity to learn vocational skills in a bakery/ restaurant setting which will give them real career opportunities where before they would have been lured away into drug-dealing and pimping.

This year our Valentines banquet will raise money to support the Murwira Orphanage near Marenge, Zimbabwe. Founder and director Paula Leen is the aunt of Carl Wilkens, the celebrated ADRA director who was the only American to stay in Rwanda throughout the duration of 1994's gruesome genocide. Paula started Murwira in 1996 and at 72 years old she is now a grandmother to 40 little boys and girls, many of whom are suffering

from acute malnutrition and even HIV/AIDS. Zimbabwe has recently been devastated by an economic collapse, seeing unemployment rates rise as high as 94%, with unprecedented rates of inflation and widespread starvation taking over the country. Murwira is the only employer in the entire Marenge area and feeds not only its resident children, but also hundreds of community people, the elderly, and widows. It also pays for hydrocephalous operations and runs an ambulance service between Marenge and the nearest hospital, about 60 miles away. Funds raised at our Valentines for Zimbabwe banquet will go to purchase food and medical supplies for the dependants of Murwira Orphanage.

In conjunction with our banquet, several youth in our church will also be participating in World Vision's 30-hour famine on February 12 in preparation for the banquet. Participants will go without food for 30 hours

in order to pray for and express solidarity with all those who suffer from hunger in Africa. Please contact me for more information, or if you would like to participate (adults are also welcome). —Pastor Rachel ##

Where Our Heart Is

Did you know that God is not needy or greedy? He doesn't need anything. From anyone. At any time. Because everything is God's. This becomes obvious when we read a few Scriptures about God. Psalm 24:1 says, "The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it." Job 41:11 adds, "Who has a claim against me that I must pay? Everything under heaven belongs to me."

The Bible even says the strength to earn money comes from God. Deuteronomy 8:17-18 says, "17You may say to yourself, 'My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me.' 18But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth."

So if it's all God's, why does God ask us to give

him a portion of his money back [cf. Malachi 3:6-8,10,17; 2 Corinthians 9:6-8]? Because He knows where are treasure is, there our hearts will be also [cf.Matthew 6:21]. And He wants our hearts to be all His.

To help us remember to do this, we're starting this new section of Focal Point entitled, *Where Our Heart Is*. Each newsletter will have an update about God's money and hopefully will encourage you to continue trusting Him with it.

Here's this edition's update:

Although tithe increased in 2009, giving to Church Budget has not kept up with our expenses. (Tithe is sent to the Conference to help pay pastors' and teachers' salaries. Only giving to church budget helps pay our expenses here.) Our high expenses are due to a combination of factors: an unprecedented rise in energy costs the last three years (did you know it costs at least \$400 to heat the church & school for just 4 hours each Sabbath morning?), a bad economy, and multiple maintenance issues (replacing the foyer tile, courtyard windows, and nearly all the heating and cooling units going bad after 25 years of use). And in order to reach our community, we have substantially increased our funding for ordinary outreach. To combat these costs, the Finance Committee recommended to the church in

Business Session a list of short term and long term ideas:

Short Term:

- 1. Sell the church bus [we bought it for \$7500 and we have already sold it 2 years later for \$6500]
- Reduce "Eat-n-Greet" to once a month and do not reimburse teams volunteering to provide food
- 3. Ask for donations of paper products for fellowship meals
- 4. Continue sending flowers for funerals and those in hospital as long as we can or send really nice cards

5.Develop visual aid as goal device for local budgetary needs

6.Reduce Dee's office hours

Long Term:

1.School subsidy reduced by 1/3 for 2010/2011 school year

- 2. Not hiring a paid office person whenever Dee retires
- 3. Consider selling cell phone tower for a lump
- 4. Negotiate higher rental cost, sharing utilities 50%
- 5. Pastor Mike and family move out of parsonage in May 2010 [saving maintenance and utility costs]
- 6. Sell church

Thank you for bringing your tithes and also remembering to contribute to local church budget in the new year. I promise to keep you informed about all short and long term ideas we consider in the new year.


