You can be a part of a new friendship ministry

Eat-n-Greet is the new buzz word at TF. You may have noticed refreshments in the lobby some weeks after the 11 o'clock service and wondered what the special occasion was. Or you may have thought, "Mmm, think I'll grab a bite to eat on my way out the door."

What's happening is that our church is embarking on a purposeful ministry, utilizing the familiar association of food to create a relaxed atmosphere of friendliness, with newcomers in mind. We want anyone who may come through our doors Saturday mornings to feel comfortable; whether it's someone taking that first step into the "church scene," or someone looking for a church home.

In today's world people are very skeptical of religion, but are looking for that something or someone to fill the hole in their heart. It is our desire at TF to make everyone feel accepted just as they are and demonstrate that God loves them like crazy.

And what easier way to create an atmosphere of comfort and acceptance than around food. The gospels record many encounters with Jesus involving food; sometimes lavish spreads, sometimes very simple fare.

Eat-n-Greet does not happen every week, only those weeks there is no potluck. The venue is the main lobby of the church immediately following the 11 o'clock service, with the presentation being very simple. The purpose of this ministry is for fellowship; especially with newcomers and those who may look a little out of place. Eating is secondary and this is not meant to be a meal, only a vehicle to the greater goal of demonstrating love for people. Keeping this in mind, we ask that children be accompanied by an adult when going to the food table.

Everyone can be part of this ministry. In fact, you are vital to it's success. All you need to do on the weeks you attend church is to stay by for awhile after the service, pick up something to hold in your hands, whether you eat or not and walk across the lobby, finding someone to shake hands and exchange a little conversation with.

If you find this a difficult thing to do or you don't know what to talk about, just ask the person you are meeting a couple questions about themselves. People usually feel comfortable talking about themselves. Spend a short time with one person and then move onto someone else. That way no one feels trapped without something to say. And don't forget to take a couple bites of cookie and hang onto your drink while you chat.

We can all become intentional in befriending new faces and everyone likes food. So the weeks we have Eat-n-Greet, share a little food and conversation. Better yet, invite your friends to church and let them find out for themselves just how friendly TF is. —Sheila Case ##

Jesus said in Matthew 6:19-21, "19Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. 20But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. 21For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

If it's true where your treasure is, your heart will be also, the reverse should also be true. Where your heart is, there your treasure will be also. That's why I've chosen the title,"Where Your Heart Is," for our 1st sermon series of 2009.
