

Dear Marilynn,

Many thanks for the check. Please thank the church on my behalf. I was so touched to receive the money. When I come in the summer I will share stories. Right now I am helping 3 children—2 girls and a boy. One is a Muslim girl who is in the 11th grade and who has been kind of disowned by her family because she be-

lieves in "Jesus Pappa."
She was 10 years old when an older family member abused her. At school she had heard of Jesus who cares. So she would tell Jesus Pappa all her heart aches. Another girl who would be used as a beast of burden to help with the stepmother's demands, now has a chance to be independent. A tenyear old boy so poor, but
