# Open Table could start in September at TF

Will you be one of ten people willing to listen, love and serve?

Are you willing to love and serve one woman rescued from strip club owners or the streets of northwest Ohio? A not-so-ordinary outreach, called Open Table, requires 10 Toledo First members willing to meet 2 hours a week @ church for a year with someone referred to us by our friends at The Daughter Project. It's a





faith-based model that is intentionally composed of church volunteers willing to listen and act as a team of life specialists, encouragers, and advocates. The volunteers must be grace-based, Christocentric, capable of being confidential, at least 18 years of age, and clearly understand how supremely important it is not to share or judge anything they hear. 1 Corinthians 5:12-13 NLT says, "12 It isn't my responsibility to judge outsiders…13 God will judge those on the outside." Our job, over the course of a year, is to shower unconditional love and support on one rescued woman that God loves like crazy and and help her set goals, foster accountability, and implement a plan for any positive change she wants to pursue.

The Open Table Inc. supplies the technical support, training, structure, and process to draw the community and congregation

together. The 'cost' is 8 to 10 people who are willing to devote one year of their lives, about 2 hours per week, (Continued on page 3, first column)







Callie Hood (not pictured) graduated from James Meade Learning Center preschool and will attend Toledo Junior Academy Kindergarten.




LilyRose Bradburn and Sofia Alvarez-Myers graduated from


