He calls us to fill our roles—to become a priesthood of all believers

An entourage, according to the dictionary, is a group of people surrounding a very important person. Within the church, that VIP is not the pastor. And it's not the people. It's Jesus. We are His entourage. The term the Bible uses to describe us is "The Priesthood of All Believers." The pre-incarnate Christ, after saving and sustaining the children of Israel, promised them in Exodus 19:6: "And you will be my kingdom

To accomplish this, we studied the pastor's role and learned that Ephesians 4:11-16 says God calls and gives churches men and women to be apostles, prophets, evangelists and pastors. People like Junia (Romans 16:7), Ellen White, Priscilla (Romans 16:3), and Rebekah Liu have answered God's call and ably fulfilled these roles. Then we studied the people's role too. And found that 1 Thessalonians 5:12-14 revealed that local leaders, both brothers and sisters, are called too. And that when they take seriously their roles as ambassadors, servants, disciplemakers, and ministers, the priesthood of all believers becomes a reality. 1 Peter 2:9 states, "You are a chosen people. You are royal priests, a holy nation, God's very own possession. As a result, you can show others the goodness of God, for he called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light." Notice now it is not "will be" anymore. When pastor and people are doing their jobs, "you are" royal priests. Mission accomplished! And if we keep up the good work, respectfully and peacefully, one day Jesus will declare: "Well done good and faithful servants. You have become a Kingdom of priests for our God" (cf. Matthew 25:21; Revelation 5:10).


- Join our Adventist friends in The Fountain Church JUN 8-JUL 13 on TUE and THUR from 5:30-7:00pm as they host a summer tennis camp for ages 15-17. We could use six volunteers 17 years or older to play tennis with unchurched people.
- Nancy Rieger runs our Panera Bread Giveaway every Friday morning. But she will be unavailable on Friday, May 8 and needs a replacement. Who will call the office and be her one week substitute?
- We could use some folks to be trained for prison ministry, community visitation, and social committee assistance.
- We could use others to be trained for leadership development and Sabbath School teaching.
- Please let me know if you're interested in learning about your spiritual gift. Allan teaches a class on that.
- Another way you can help is when the church gathers for weekly study and worship, do so! Based on your feedback, we're including more hymns each week from each praise team in the 11am service. Lend your wisdom and presence and voice to support every generation and tribe in study and worship.
- When the church gathers every three months for quarterly business meetings, be there! Encourage the finance committee and guide the personnel committee and help us plan

- our ordinary outreach and evangelistic efforts.
- In 2013, 20 people were baptized or joined our church and most of them were young people. But we're not doing as well reaching adults. Our What the Bible Says About meetings are an attempt to do so. I think it would be great if everyone in this church supported at least one evangelistic series each year. I'm not saying you should support spring and fall. I'm saying I think you should support spring or fall. Twice a week. Maybe some of you are saying, "Well, I've heard those presentations." Well, maybe you have. But by being there, you can make it a lot more comfortable for those who haven't. The median age of the church keeps rising. We need to reach the young and the old. Inside and outside the church. Our ongoing mix of ordinary outreach and seasonal evangelistic invitations will hopefully help us do so. Jesus made invitations (Luke 14:15-24). We should too.
- I had a friend in Florida call me a couple days ago by mistake. But since he had me on the phone, he took the time to pray for me. I was so grateful. Prayer is a powerful way you can get more involved. I'm grateful Sharon and Bill run our email/phone prayer chain. But we could also use prayer partners at the front of the church leading intercessory prayers at the end of each worship service.

Winding Down and Gearing Up at TJA

At Toledo Junior Academy, we are getting ready to wind down another school year. Likewise, it is time now for us to be anticipating enrollment for the coming fall. We currently have 31 students but would love to see our numbers grow. If you know of anyone who might be a good fit for our school, this would be a good time to get them thinking. If money is an issue, we have a few resources we can pull from to help out.

First, if a child is currently attending a public school or will be entering as a first time kindergartner in the fall, and lives in a school district that is deemed "at risk" by the state, then they are eligible to have their full tuition paid for by the state, regardless of the parents' income. Next, if a child is entering kindergarten, first, or second grades and the household income is below 200% of the poverty level, then that child is also eligible to have their tuition paid by the state.

If a family is not eligible for either of these, then the Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund, a volunteer organization offering financial assistance to private school students, offers scholarships, through a drawing, covering nearly half the cost of tuition for eligible families.

Last, church families who do not qualify for any of the above often seek a portion of aid from the church, and the church is generous in helping where they can. If you know of any child who would benefit from our school environment, please direct them our way. Ask Mrs. Hall for the info and paperwork.

How Can I Help?

Even with all of these opportunities for tuition assistance, many families still struggle with the necessary finances to put their children through Christian education. Many of our students depend on donations from people like you, often anonymous donations, that help relieve the financial burdens of our families. But still, there is never enough. When there are just a few who make major donations, and then those few can no longer give, our school suffers greatly.

Consider giving to the church's Worthy Student Fund so that when decisions are made in the fall to help church families, the funds don't have to be spread quite so thin. Consider giving to the school, even anonymously, so that we can apply funds directly to those accounts that are most deserving and most in need, especially in times of family emergencies. Consider giving directly to the school budget so that we can use the money wherever it is most necessary at the time. Thank you.—Mrs. Vicki Hall, Principal ##
