SCRIP helps school

Remember, each of us can help the school earn money with no extra cost to ourselves. Simply purchase gift cards which you can use for gas, groceries, home improvements, clothing—anything you already buy. Our school, Toledo Junior Academy, then receives a percentage of the money vou spend—at NO COST TO YOU. That's right, you purchase a gift card for \$25 and you get the full value when you spend it. In addition the school receives either 2.74% up to 8.74% of what the value of the gift card is. It's one of those Win/Win situations. Pick up a SCRIP order form in the literature rack opposite the mailboxes at church. Insert the form in the order box in the school hallway. Orders placed by Monday are available Thursday of the same week. It's easy to support our school! ##

Safety/Security Team forming

From a statistical perspective, a place of worship remains one of the safest environments. However, the understanding that the odds are "something won't happen", needs to be coupled with a sense of precaution and the ability and willingness to foresee danger. Proverbs 22:3 (NLT) says, "A prudent person foresees danger and takes precautions. The simpleton goes blindly on and suffers the consequences." History has sadly and tragically revealed to us that to blindly and faithfully follow the notion that places of worship are exempt from the dangers of the real world puts God's people at risk. That's why the deacons are inviting all Sabbath School teachers and church members

interested in the safety and security of people at church to their deacons meetings taking place after church (and after potluck on the days there is one - bring a brown bag sack lunch for all other days). Aside from clarifying the roles of deacons and the roles of a newly



forming safety and security team, this group will be meeting monthly on the first Sabbath of the month throughout the year to learn more about profiling, responding instead of reacting, and what to do during a fire, missing child, or emergency evacuation. Join us. —Pastor Mike ##
